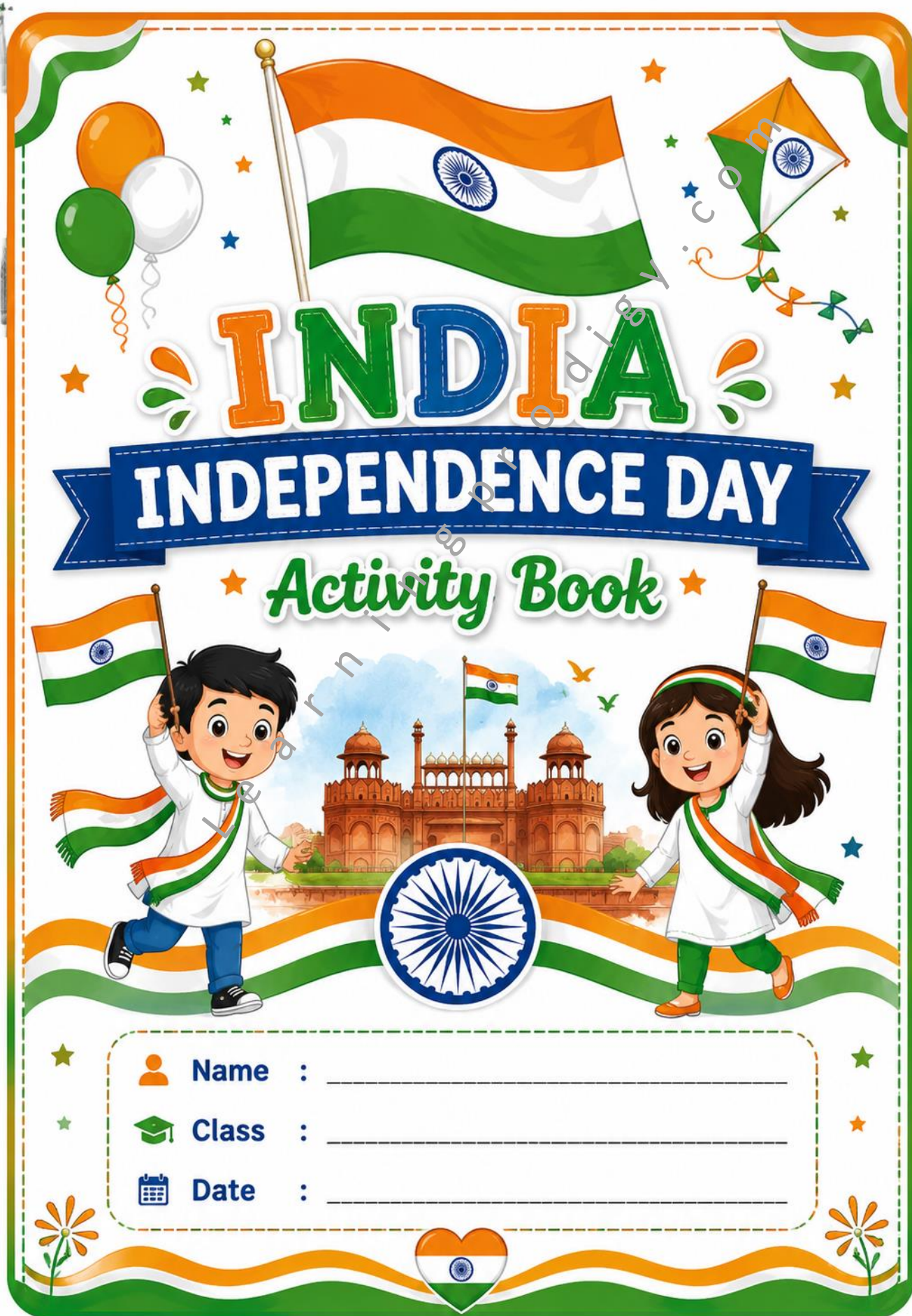






India Independence Day – Reading Comprehension

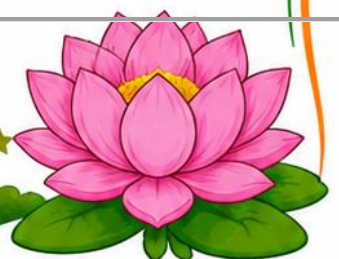

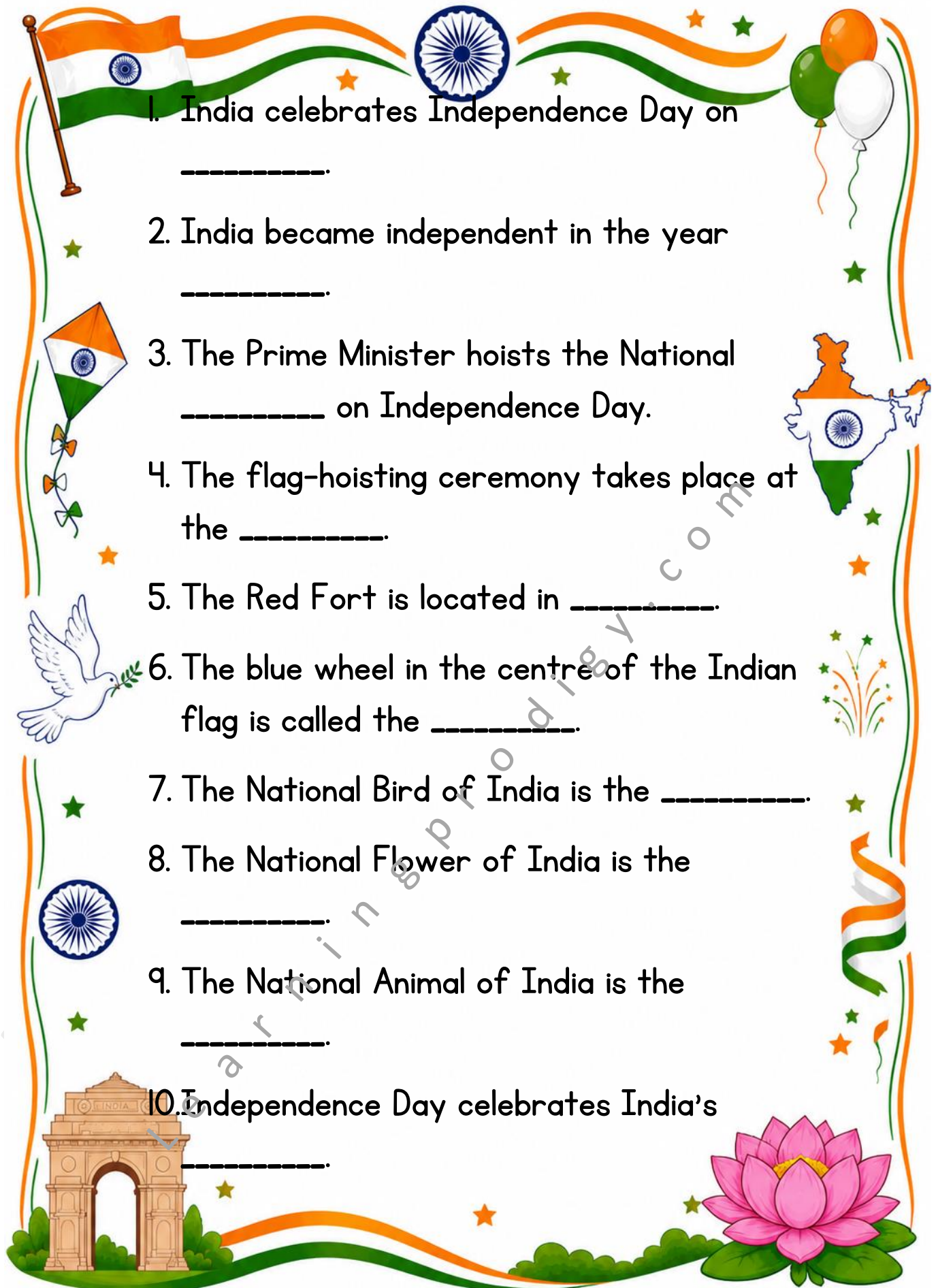
