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ALL ABOUT RAKSHA BANDHAN

What is Raksha Bandhan?

Raksha Bandhan is a special Indian festival that celebrates the love, care, and bond between siblings.

When is it celebrated?

It is celebrated on the full moon day (Purnima) of the Hindu month of Shravan. The date changes each year.

What is a Rakhi?

 A Rakhi is a colourful decorative thread or bracelet that is tied around a sibling's wrist as a symbol of love and affection.



How is it celebrated?

Families come together, siblings exchange Rakhis, gifts, sweets, and blessings, and spend special time with one another.

What does Rakhi symbolize?

Rakhi represents love, protection, respect, friendship, and the special connection between siblings.

DID YOU KNOW?

The word "Raksha" means protection and "Bandhan" means bond or relationship.

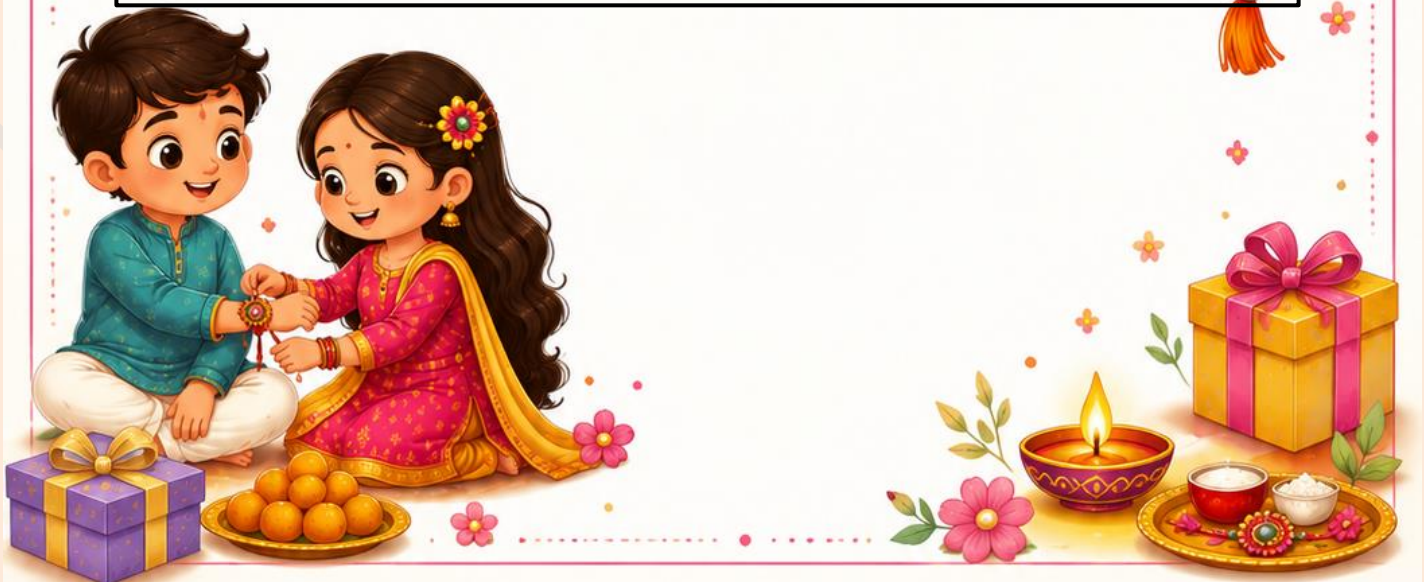

A **Rakhi** is a colourful thread or bracelet. A sibling ties the Rakhi around their brother's or sister's wrist as a symbol of love, care, and affection. The siblings exchange gifts and sweets and give each other warm wishes.
